Post WWII Desegregation Efforts Continued

- 1. Brown v. Board of Education
 - a. Oliver Brown filed a lawsuit against the board of education in Topeka, Kansas
 - i. Daughter was not allowed to attend school closest to home
 - ii. Said it violated the 14th amendment (equal protection clause)
 - iii. May 17th, 1954 Supreme Court ruled it violated the 14th Amendment and schools need to integrate
 - iv. Court left it up to school districts and local/state courts
- 2. Little Rock Nine
 - a. The 1st 9 African American students to attend Little Rock High School in Arkansas
 - b. Governor tried stopping it, president sent in the army & national guard -> stayed for the year.
 - c. The 9 experienced harassment and violence
 - d. School closed at the end of the year.
- 3. Medgar Evers
 - a. Civil rights activist
 - b. Worked with NAACP, investigated the lynching of Emmett Till
 - c. Killed in 1963 by white supremacist Byron de La Beckwith- originally found not guilty
 - d. Care reopened in 1990, found guilty -> life in prison
- 4. Governor George Wallace
 - a. Leading racist/segregationist in the country
 - b. Shot by Arthur Bremer -> wanting fame
 - c. Wallace was left paralyzed
 - Had a conversion -> spent rest of his life trying to fix what he had done/apologize
