- 1. Diogenes
 - a. Student of Antisthenes
 - b. Disdain for others, believes Plato is arrogant/prideful
 - Gives Plato a plucked chicken as a present -> Plato defines man as 2 footed featherless animal
 - ii. Claims he can't see Platos tableness only tables
 - 1. Plato's response -> Diogenes has eyes but no intellect
 - c. Asks Alexander the great to block the sun
 - d. Characterizes Socrates as a madman -> he is as mad as Socrates
 - e. Opposes natural to law and reason to suffering
 - f. Lived in a barrel or tub
- 2. Cynics
 - a. Chief good is to live according to virtue
 - b. Men should live simply
 - i. Despise riches, glory and noble birth
 - c. Self-Sufficiency
 - d. Virtue can be taught, once achieved it can't be lost
 - e. Be indifferent to everything not connected to virtue or vice
 - f. Wanted to abolish logic and natural philosophy
 - g. Only the good should be studied
- 3. Zeno
 - a. Too modest to be a cynic
 - i. Had a sense of shame
 - b. Honored by Athens for encouraging men to practice virtue
 - c. Worked to avoid large crowds
 - d. Not a happy man, always frowning
 - e. Man of abstinence and endurance of simple habits
