 - b. "Big 4" wanted to prevent a huge war again.
 - i. Legally binding
 - c. China, US, Great Britain, Russia & France ->permanent
 - d. 193 member countries
 - e. Downsides
 - i. Doesn't really stop anything
 - ii. Incredibly expensive
 - f. Declaration of Human Rights
 - i. Declared on December 10th, 1948
- 2. Tokyo Trials
 - a. Modeled after Nuremberg
 - b. Crimes against peace was a prered for Tokyo Trials
 - c. 3 things had to be proven
 - i. Crimes were systematic & widespread
 - ii. The accused knew that it was happening
 - iii. Accused had power to stop the crime
 - d. Separate trials convicted more than 5,500 lower officials.
 - e. General Hideki Tojo
 - i. Found guilty and hung
- 3. Emperor Hirohito
 - a. Not tried-> US needed him to help turn Japan into ally
 - i. Needed help with Soviet Union
- 4. US Dictates Japan's Constitution
 - a. Still in effect today
 - i. 100 articles in constitution
 - b. Hirohito renounced divinity
 - c. Japan not allowed to declare war
