Post WWII Desegregation Efforts

- 1. Desegregation of the U.S. Army
 - a. Military was segregated since Revolutionary War
 - i. Often in less important roles
 - b. Truman was told blacks would resist the draft if he didn't end segregation.
 - c. Truman signed Executive Order 9981 to desegregate the armed forces in 1948.
 - i. Desegregation took 6 years
 - ii. Finally complete in 1954
- 2. Adam Clayton Powell
 - a. Congressman from Harlem, New York from 1945 to 1971
 - b. Worked tirelessly on civil rights issues
 - c. Charged with tax evasion and misuse of funds for vacation
- 3. Jackie Robinson
 - a. First African American major league baseball player
 - b. Signed with the Dodgers
 - c. The "great experiment" was to see if they could make it work
 - d. Robinson had an amazing career
 - i. Helped Dodgers win the World Series in 1955
 - ii. Inducted into the Baseball Hall of Fame-> 1st African American
